Title of Best Practice 1: Mock Budget: Awareness & Understanding National Budget

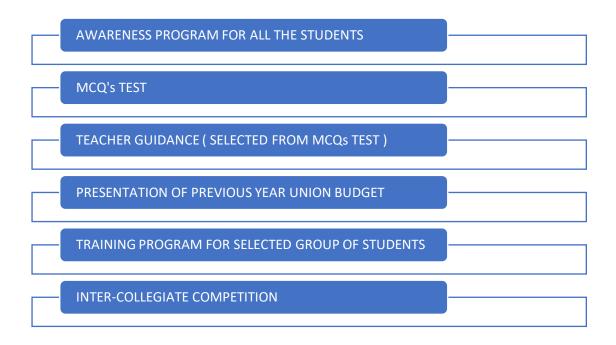
Objective:

To enhance students' understanding of the National Budget through a structured, multi-phase awareness program aimed at building analytical skills and budget presentation competencies. This program engages students from various departments in evaluative, presentation, and competitionbased activities culminating in an intercollegiate event.

Scope:

This SOP applies to students of St Paul college as well as other colleges. who are interested in gaining insights into the formulation, components, and implications of the Union Budget.

PROCESS OF MOCK BUDGET: UNDERSTANDING AND AWARENESS OF NATIONAL BUDGET



1. Program Introduction and Awareness

- To introduce students to the fundamentals of the Union Budget and encourage active participation.
- Conduct an awareness session explaining the importance of understanding the National Budget in the month of June July
- Distribute informative handouts and resources for initial self-study
- Provide a program schedule and outline participation guidelines.

2. MCQ Test

The MCQs test will be held in the month of August - September

- To assess students' baseline knowledge and select participants for further stages.
- The MCQ test will cover basic aspects of the previous year's Union Budget.
- Only students scoring above 60% will qualify for the next stage.
- Faculty coordinators to prepare and administer the MCQ test.
- Evaluation of test results and shortlisting of successful candidates.

3. Teacher Guidance and Mentorship

- To guide selected students and deepen their understanding of budget components.
- Assign faculty mentors to each group for personalized support.
- Conduct interactive sessions focused on essential budget topics like allocations, fiscal policies, and implications.
- session on Guidance lectures on MOCK BUDGET conduct in month of September October
- Students gain clarity on Union Budget aspects and presentation expectations for the next phase.

4. PPT Presentation on Previous Year's Union Budget

This will be held in month of December

- To assess students' analytical and presentation skills through group projects.
- Each group must consist of a minimum of two students.
- Presentations should cover key sections of the previous year's Union Budget, including analysis and reflections.

- Content accuracy and depth of analysis
- Presentation skills and group coordination
- Creativity and engagement with the audience
- Faculty members evaluate presentations and provide constructive feedback.

5. Selection for Mock Budget Training

- To select high-performing groups for the Mock Budget training phase.
- Faculty evaluators will review PPT presentations and select groups based on performance metrics.
- Selected groups will receive additional training to participate in a simulated Mock Budget.

6. Intercollegiate Mock Budget Event

The intercollegiate mock budget event conducted in the month of January-February

- To provide a platform for students to apply their presentation skills, budget understanding and compete at an intercollegiate level.
- Groups will present a Mock Budget with hypothetical scenarios.
- A panel of judges will evaluate based on presentation skills, budgetary analysis, policy justification, and financial planning.
- The winning teams at the intercollegiate mock budget event will be declared as: Winner, 1st Runner up, 2nd Runner up, based on their overall performance and innovative approach to budget planning.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- Faculty: Oversee program execution, mentor students, and evaluate performance.
- **Student Participants:** Commit to active engagement in all phases, from awareness to final event presentation.
- Judging Panel: Evaluate the intercollegiate event presentations and declare winners.

Expected Outcomes:

- Students gain a comprehensive understanding of the national Budget.
- Enhanced analytical, teamwork, and presentation skills among participants.
- Increased awareness of national fiscal policies and budget impact.

Documentation:

• Attendance records, test scores, and final event scoring sheets will be maintained for future reference and program improvement.

Review and Feedback:

feedback will be collected from participants, faculty, and judges to assess program effectiveness and areas for improvement.
